## A CASA's guide to attending court hearings

- 1. Please dress in professional attire. (no jeans, sneakers, or athleisure wear)
- 2. Arrive to the courthouse between 8:00 and 8:15 a.m. with your CASA badge.
- 3. The courtroom doors open at approximately 8:15 a.m.
- 4. Check in with the court officer.
- 5. If you have not received a copy of the social worker's report, this can be requested through your advocacy supervisor.
- 6. If they are present, a Voices for Children staff member will introduce you to the professionals on the case.
- 7. If your case child is present, you can wait with them outside the courtroom.
- 8. When the case is called, sit at the table, closest to the middle as possible; or sit in the chair provided close to the table. The court officer will tell you where to sit if you are unsure.
- 9. Ensure that the court officer announces your presence and that the judge indicates they have read and considered your report.
- 10. If the judge asks if you have anything to add, you may highlight a particular recommendation, concern, or positive attribute of your case child. Keep your remarks to several sentences.
- 11. When addressing the judge, please stand and refer to the judge as "Your Honor."
- 12. If your supervisor did not attend the hearing with you, send an email to your supervisor with details of what occurred at the hearing.
